Amongst these are the church’s nominated charities this year: Admiral Nurses (www.fordementia.org.uk), which provides specialist nursing help for patients with dementia, and the Kerala Balagram Manganam (www.christavashram.8m.com), which provides homes and education for a group of destitute boys in India.
